


Embase® on ProQuest Dialog: Identifying Documents Sourced from MEDLINE® and Embase

Embase includes all complete MEDLINE documents, as well as those which are indexed independently by Elsevier for Embase. Documents which are sourced from MEDLINE can be identified in the document display when the first or second entry in the Subject list is 'MEDLINE'. Those which are covered by Embase are now also identifiable, and have as their first entry 'Embase'. Those which are covered by both MEDLINE and Embase have both terms, e.g.:

You can search MEDL(YES) and EMBASE(YES) to find documents covered by either source, and we've added a new checkbox for 'Embase' to the Advanced Search page options for this purpose too:
